Why is the Internet is so awesome?

- Decentralized, neutral network
 - Intelligence is at the edge, not in the core
 - Allows anyone to quickly, cheaply, and easily experiment with new ideas, technologies, and business models on a global scale.
 - No special permission required

What's happening?

A change in market behavior taking place among large access networks and content providers which will undermine and potentially eliminate the Internet's neutral properties.

Examples: Zero-rated services, fast-lanes, sponsored bandwidth

What are the risks?

- Internet monopolized by a small number of powerful companies
 - Fragmented global Internet ecosystem
 - Industry regulations can be undermined
 - Net Neutrality is a key underlying assumption on which many Internet related policies are based.

What's happening around the world?

- Non-neutral services banned in multiple countries: Chile, Brazil, USA, others
- Internet.org roll-out
 - Zambia, Kenya, others
 - Partnerships with UNICEF, SuperSport, AccuWeather
 - Street protests in India
